Anonymous donor offers \$5,000 reward leading to arrest in Dwane Simmons homicide

TOPEKA, Kan. – An anonymous donor associated with Washburn University has given Shawnee County Crime Stoppers \$5,000 to be used for a reward leading to the arrest of a suspect in the Dwane Simmons homicide case.

Along with this \$5,000 reward, Shawnee County Crime Stoppers is still offering up to \$2,000 for information leading to an arrest in this case.

At approximately 12:46 a.m. Sunday, April 28, officers from the Topeka Police Department responded to the 1400 block of SW 13th in reference to a disturbance with gunshots in the area. Upon arrival, officers discovered an adult male victim who was deceased. The victim of the homicide was later identified as 23-year-old Dwane D. Simmons.

While Shawnee County Crime Stoppers does not offer enhanced rewards, the organization does accept reward money from citizens or organizations.
