



Enos Garcia Elementary School and Nurture Center strives to provide quality educational opportunities while supporting and advocating for children and families, many of whom are grandparents parenting their grandchildren.

Shared Table, in partnership with El Pueblito United Methodist Church distributes food, basic healthcare items and some school supplies on the 2nd and 4th Wednesdays, 9:00-11:30 at El Pueblo UMC and 1:30-3:00 at Talpa Community Center.

Taos NEST (Navigating Emergency Support Together) is a Dream Tree Projectled program assisting community members in accessing emergency shelter and support services.

Bridges for Education provides free, individualized college counseling and support programs for students of all ages, helping with applications, financial aid, and guidance in choosing the best colleges for their needs and academic, career and life goals.

Taos Search and Rescue is a group of volunteers giving time, skills and resources to assist people lost or injured in the New Mexico wilderness and beyond.

Taos County Crime Stoppers is the public, police and private sector working together for a safer Taos County by offering anonymous methods for the public to report information regarding unsolved crimes and fugitives.
